Join us for a Disaster Recovery and Economic Resilience Workshop designed for the Centralina counties that received a disaster declaration for Hurricanes Florence and Michael – Anson, Cabarrus, Iredell, Stanly, Rowan and Union. This event will allow communities to better understand recovery from a comprehensive perspective and highlight not only disaster specific information, but also how other available grant and technical assistance resources may be leveraged to help support a strong recovery and build resilient communities.

Topics will cover strategic considerations in planning and implementing recovery and prevention efforts, economic resiliency planning, available federal resources and grant applications, administration and compliance. This workshop will also provide community leaders with information on the recently passed **H.R.2157: Additional Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Act of 2019**, critical bipartisan legislation that provides **\$19.1 billion** to help Americans recover from the catastrophic disasters that struck the nation in the past three years. Attendees will have the opportunity to meet with agency representatives to discuss potential projects or needs specific to their communities.
