She served as the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Chief Operating Officer from 2013 to 2017 and served on the U.S. House of Representatives Appropriations Committee from 2007 to 2013. Currently, Ms. Hogshead oversees the expenditure of hurricane recovery funds from HUD for areas hit by hurricanes Matthew and Florence. She also oversees the expenditure of U.S. Department of Treasury Coronavirus Relief Fund and Emergency Rental Assistance allocations through the state's pandemic-related emergency rental assistance program.

Dr. Dawn Baldwin Gibson is the Executive Pastor of Peletah Ministries and serves as Executive Director of the Peletah Institute for Building Resilient Communities. She and her husband, Pastor Anthony Gibson, co-founded the church in 2011. In 2020, she was appointed by NC Governor Roy Cooper to serve on the Board of Trustees at Pamlico Community College. She is the Founding Chairperson of the Pamlico County Disaster Recovery Coalition. Dr. Dawn also serves as the Co-Chair of the NC Inclusive Disaster Recovery Network's African American Council and was the past Emotional and Spiritual Care Task Force Chairperson for the North Carolina Voluntary Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD). She has authored and/or assisted with grants for more than three million dollars for community resiliency and hurricane relief/recovery programs including United States Department of Agriculture, School to Work, Golden Leaf Foundation, Blue Cross/Blue Shield, WalMart, Food Lion, Dollar General, and many more.

Joe Stanton is an Assistant Director for North Carolina Department of Public Safety's Division of Emergency Management. He has been involved in disaster recovery work for over 25 years. For the last eighteen years he has been with Emergency Management working in the recovery section. During these years he has served as a supervisor, section manager, and as the Recovery Chief, overseeing the day-to-day operations of Recovery. Joe currently serves as Recovery's Program Delivery Chief, where he is responsible for the overall coordination of state and federal disaster recovery programs by supporting the delivery of these services to disaster survivors and applicants. Throughout his career with NCEM, he has worked over thirty-five federal disaster declarations and forty state disaster declarations. Joe has served on numerous state and federal committees to improve policies and programs in disaster recovery. His expertise has been in helping states and communities in developing recovery plans. Joe has a background in project management and community development, and before coming to NCEM he served as an executive director of a communitybased nonprofit. Joe is a native of North Carolina and has enjoyed living in Eastern North Carolina with his wife Cheryl for over thirty years.
