Through technical assistance and staff support, we leverage public and private funds to provide community partners with housing, public infrastructure and small business growth opportunities in support of a stronger, prosperous region.

Community Revitalization and Grant Support

Centralina CED helps communities build equity and resiliency by reviving neighborhoods, enhancing commercial properties and bolstering downtown economic activity. Our staff takes into consideration important factors such as historical buildings and community culture when creating local redevelopment plans and resiliency initiatives. To implement these revitalization plans, we identify funding resources, match communities with local contractors and develop partnerships with nonprofits. We also work alongside a federal relations consultant to cultivate a list of [grants opportunities and forecasts](#). - North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality infrastructure grants, water/sewer improvements and asset inventory grants

Regional Economic Development

Centralina CED staffs and manages the Centralina Economic Development District (EDD), a public-private entity created to



empower local communities by preparing and implementing U.S. Department of Commerce and U.S. EDA strategic plans and grant applications. The Centralina EDD develops and maintains the regional [Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy](#) (CEDS) and recently launched the [Regional Resilience Collaborative](#) to build upon existing county and city-level emergency plans through a series of plan evaluations, focus groups and workshops with the goal of coordinating regional resources for greater efficiency in responding to current and future disasters.

Local Government Support

The Centralina EDD can help local governments develop EDA grants for public infrastructure to support economic development projects. This includes liaising with EDA representatives, helping with grant application development and grant management, upon reward. We can also help prepare grants for the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).
