Notes on the FY23 Appropriations



On December 29, 2022, President Biden signed into law the \$1.65 trillion omnibus bill to fund the government through September 2023. The omnibus bill provides \$1 million in funding for the North Mecklenburg County Housing Preservation Initiative that was requested by Centralina and supported by Congresswoman Alma Adams. The bill also provides \$772.5 billion in nondefense discretionary funding, up almost 6% from \$730 billion from FY22.

The FY23 appropriations funding includes modest increases to most Older Americans Act programs and more significant increases to the Economic Development Administration, the Department of Transportation and the Department of Housing and Urban Development. 
