REGIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT

This Regional Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Agreement made and entered into this 1st day of June 2021, by and between the law enforcement agencies listed in the attached "List of Participating Agencies" and any other agencies added to this Agreement by amendment ("Participating Agencies").

BASIS FOR AGREEMENT

North Carolina General Statutes Sections 160A-288, 153A-212 and 90-95.2 allow and authorize mutual aid assistance and cooperation between law enforcement agencies. The Participating Agencies wish to provide temporary assistance to one another in enforcing the General Statutes of North Carolina and acknowledge that this Agreement mutually benefits each Participating Agency in the form of enhanced law enforcement capabilities and efficiency within the jurisdiction of each Agency.

AGREEMENT

The Participating Agencies agree to the following terms and conditions:

1. REQUESTING ASSISTANCE

- a. REQUEST FOR ASSISTANCE. Under North Carolina General Statutes Sections 160A-288 and 90-95.2 any Participating Agency may request of the other the temporary lending of personnel, equipment and supplies. Execution of this Agreement by each undersigned agency constitutes and is deemed to be a standing request for assistance and an agreement to lend assistance as personnel and equipment permit by each Participating Agency.
- **b. WRITTEN REQUEST.** When temporary assistance is needed pursuant to this Agreement, the head of the Requesting Agency shall notify the head of the Assisting Agency of the need for such assistance and the requested assistance shall be provided if feasible to do so. Such request shall be made in writing whenever possible. Notification by the Division of Criminal Information (DCI) network shall be deemed written notification.

In accordance with North Carolina General Statutes Section 90-95.2(b1) requests for assistance shall be made by the head of an agency or an officer of the agency to whom the head of the agency has delegated that authority, but only one officer within the agency shall have the delegated authority at one time.

The following sample statement used as part of a DCI message would satisfy the statutory requirements for notification and may streamline the process:

Regional Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Agreement June 1, 2021

The [REQUESTING AGENCY NAME] acting under the authority of [REQUESTING AGENCY DIRECTOR AND TITLE] is requesting mutual aid assistance from the [ASSISTING AGENCY NAME]. The [REQUESTING AGENCY] requests [RESOURCES] to assist at [LOCATION]. The duration of this aid shall be [TIME FRAME].

c. EMERGENCY REQUEST. In an emergency situation, the notification of the need for emergency assistance need not be in writing, but a written notification shall be provided as soon thereafter as possible. In an emergency situation, the notification may be made by telephone or radio contact.

2. **DUTIES OF REQUESTING AGENCY**

- a. OPERATIONAL COMMAND. While operating with the Requesting Agency under this Agreement, a law enforcement officer of an Assisting Agency shall be subject to the lawful operational command of the officer supervising the division or unit to which he or she is temporarily assigned to provide assistance, and shall operate under the direct supervision of said officer.
- **b. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS**. The officer supervising the division or unit to which the Assisting Agency's officer(s) is temporarily assigned shall provide a report to the head of the Assisting Agency summarizing the hours worked and the assignments performed by the temporarily assigned officer(s).
- c. EQUIPMENT. The temporarily assigned officer(s) shall report to duty with the Requesting Agency with necessary equipment that has been issued by his or her own agency. The Requesting Agency shall supply the temporarily assigned officer with any additional money, equipment, supplies and/or support personnel reasonably necessary to perform his or her expected duties. If the Requesting Agency issues to temporarily assigned officer(s) any equipment that requires specialized training or certification, the Requesting Agency shall ascertain that the temporarily assigned officer(s) has undergone the necessary training or possesses the required certification.

3. **DUTIES OF ASSISTING AGENCY**

- **a. BENEFITS.** For personnel and administrative purposes, the temporarily assigned officer(s) shall remain under the authority and control of their own Agency, and shall be entitled to Worker's Compensation and other benefits to which he or she would normally be entitled were he or she not temporarily assigned.
- **b. DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS.** Disciplinary actions arising out of temporary assistance provided under this Agreement shall remain the responsibility of the Assisting Agency. The officer

> in charge of the division or unit in which an officer is temporarily assigned pursuant to this Agreement may, at any time, relieve such officer of his or her duties and shall immediately forward a written statement setting forth the reason for such action to the head of the Assisting Agency or their designee.

4. AUTHORITY OF ASSIGNED OFFICERS

While temporarily assigned to the Requesting Agency, law enforcement officer(s) of the Assisting Agency shall have the same jurisdiction, powers, rights, authority, benefits and immunities as the regular officers of the Requesting Agency in addition to those associated with his or her regular employment. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed as limiting or reducing any Participating Agency or officer's common law or statutory authority, including but not limited to the common law power of *posse comitatus* or the statutory authority conferred by North Carolina General Statute Section I5A-402.

5. INSURANCE AND INDEMNITY

- **a. LIABILTY INSURANCE**. The head of each Participating Agency certifies by execution of this Agreement that all employees subject to this Agreement or reasonably expected to be subject to this Agreement, including assisting officers, are covered by liability insurance.
- b. INDEMNITY FOR ACTS OR OMISSIONS. The Requesting Agency specifically covenants and agrees to assume liability for any act or omission which was committed by, or was the responsibility of, the temporarily assigned officer(s), except as otherwise provided for in this Agreement. The Requesting Agency further agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the Assisting Agency for any damages or costs, including attorney's fees, incurred by the Assisting Agency in this regard. The provisions of this paragraph regarding indemnity shall not apply to any Participating Agency whose officers are employees of the sovereign State of North Carolina and covered by the Tort Claims Act.
- c. INDEMNITY FOR PROPERTY DAMAGE. The Requesting Agency agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the Assisting Agency for any damages or injury to the property of the Requesting Agency incurred in the course and scope of a temporarily assigned officer's duties. The Assisting Agency agrees to hold harmless the Requesting Agency for any damages or injury to the property of the Assisting Agency. The provisions of this paragraph regarding indemnity shall not apply to any Agency whose officers are employees of the sovereign State of North Carolina and covered by the Tort Claims Act.
- **d. RIGHTS OF SUBROGATION.** This Agreement shall not, however, be construed as a bar to any other rights or claims, either direct or by way of subrogation, which either Agency shall have against any other entity, party or person.

6. TERM AND WITHDRAWAL

- **a. TERM**. In any event, the term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years from the date first above written and shall terminate automatically at the expiration of that term.
- **b. WITHDRAWAL**. In the event a Participating Agency should desire to withdraw from this Agreement, the head of that Agency shall provide written notice to the head of the other Participating Agencies setting forth the effective date of such withdrawal.

7. OTHER MUTUAL AID AGREEMENTS

This Agreement does not affect any other service or mutual aid agreement, previously entered into between two or more of the Participating Agencies for other services not contemplated by this Agreement, nor prevents the Participating Agencies from entering into other such agreements.

8. GOVERNING BODY AUTHORIZATION

The head of each Participating Agency certifies by execution of this Agreement that their duly elected governing body has adopted an appropriate resolution or ordinance authorizing said Agency head to enter into this Agreement pursuant to North Carolina General Statutes Sections 160A-288 and 90-95.2. A copy of the authorizing resolution or ordinance for each Participating Agency shall be attached to this original Agreement and to each duplicate original of this Agreement.

9. <u>ADDITIONAL PARTICIPATING AGENCIES</u>

Additional law enforcement agencies may participate in this Agreement by contacting Centralina Regional Council and signing an Amendment. Any Additional Participating Agencies will be bound by the Agreement to the same extent as all other Participating Agencies. The Filing Requirements of paragraph 10 below apply to each amendment.

10. FILING REQUIREMENTS AND COPIES OF AGREEMENT

A complete, digital version of this Agreement shall be kept at the offices of Centralina Regional Council. Copies of the digital version including all received signature pages and amendments will be distributed in PDF format to all Participating Agencies. Any Participating Agency may file this Agreement with its County Clerk of Court,

RESOLUTION 22-10 ADOPTING A POLICY FOR MUTUAL AID ASSISTANCE WITH OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

WHEREAS, pursuant to North Carolina General Statutes GS 160A-288 and GS 90-95.2, the governing body of a city or county may adopt appropriate guidelines, for the purpose of mutual aid assistance with other municipal and county law enforcement agencies; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said laws, the law enforcement assistance to be rendered authorizes lending officers to work temporarily with other officers of the requesting agencies, including in an undercover capacity, and lending equipment and supplies; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the best interest of the City of Albemarle to adopt a reasonable policy and guidelines whereby reciprocal law enforcement assistance can both be rendered to and obtained from other governmental jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, such reciprocal assistance is necessary for effective law enforcement for the protection of the citizens of the City of Albemarle,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALBEMARLE THAT:

The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to enter into mutual assistance arrangements with other municipal and county law enforcement agencies, provided that the head of the requesting law enforcement agency makes such a request in writing.

- 2. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to permit officers of the Albemarie Police

 Department to work temporarily with the officers of the requesting agency, including in
 an undercover capacity; and the Chief of Police may lend such equipment and supplies
 to the requesting agencies as he/she deems advisable.
- The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to request officers of other law enforcement agencies to work temporarily with officers of the Albemarle Police Department including in an undercover capacity; and the Chief of Police may borrow such equipment and supplies from other law enforcement agencies as he/she deems advisable.
- *4. All such requests and authorizations shall be in accordance with North Carolina General Statutes 160A-288 and 90-95.2, as applicable.

While working with a requesting agency, an officer shall, have the same jurisdiction, powers, rights, privileges and immunities including those relating to the defense of civil actions and payment of judgments as the officers of the requesting agency in addition to those he/she normal possesses.

- 6. While on duty with the requesting agency, an officer shall be subject to the lawful operational commands of his/her superior officers in the requesting agency, but shall, for personnel and administrative purposes, remain under the control of his/her own agency, including for purposes of pay. An officer shall furthermore be entitled to Worker's Compensation and the same benefits to the extent as though he/she were functioning within the normal scope of his/her duties.
- 7. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to enter into mutual assistance agreements with other law enforcement agencies in accordance with such reasonable arrangements, terms, and conditions as may be agreed upon between the respective heads of the law enforcement agencies.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING GUIDELINES FOR MUTUAL ASSISTANCE WITH OTHER MUNICIPAL AND COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

WHEREAS, pursuant to statutory amendments adopted by the 1977 General Assembly of North Carolina, the governing body of a city or county may adopt appropriate guidelines for the provision of mutual assistance between or among municipal and county law enforcement agencies, such authority being codified as Chapter 160A, Section 288, of the General Statutes of North Carolina;

While on duty with the requesting agency, an officer shall be subject to the lawful operational commands of his/her superior officers in the requesting agency, but shall, for personnel and administrative purposes, remain under the control of his/her own agency, including for purposes of pay. An officer shall furthermore be entitled to Worker's Compensation and the same benefits to the extent as though he/she were functioning within the normal scope of his/her duties.
- 7. The Police Chief is hereby authorized to enter into mutual assistance agreements with other law enforcement agencies in accordance with such reasonable arrangements, terms, and conditions as may be agreed upon between the respective heads of the law enforcement agencies.

RESOLUTION

ADOPTING A POLICY FOR MUTUAL AID ASSISTANCE

WITH OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

WHEREAS, pursuant to North Carolina General Statues GS106A-288 and GS 90-95.2, the governing body of a city or county may adopt appropriate guidelines, for the purpose of mutual aid with other municipal and county law enforcement agencies; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said laws, the law enforcement assistance to be rendered authorizes lending officer to work temporality with officers of the requesting agencies, including in an undercover capacity, and lending equipment and supplies; and

WHEREAS, is it seemed to be the best interest of Davidson College Campus Police Department to adopt a reasonable policy and guidelines whereby reciprocal law enforcement assistance can both be rendered to and obtained from other governmental jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, such reciprocal assistance is necessary for effective law enforcement for the protection of the citizens of Davidson College.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY DAVIDSON COLLEGE THAT:

- 1. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to enter into mutual assistance arrangement with other municipal and county law enforcement agencies, provided that the head of the requesting law enforcement agency makes such a request in writing.
- 2. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to permit officers of the Davidson College Campus Police Department to work temporarily with the Officers of the requesting agency, including in an undercover capacity; and the Chief of Police may lend such equipment and supplies to the requesting agencies as he/she deems advisable.
- 3. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to request officers of another law enforcement agencies to work temporarily with officers of the Davidson College Campus Police Department including in an undercover capacity; and the Chief of Police may borrow such equipment and supplies from other law enforcement agencies as he/she deems advisable.
- 4. All such requests and authorizations shall be in accordance with North Carolina General Statues 160A-288 and 90-95.2, as applicable.
- 5. While working with a requesting agency, an officer shall, have the same jurisdiction, powers, rights, privileges, and immunities including those relating to the defense of civil actions and payment of judgments as the officer of the requesting agency in addition to those he/she normally possesses.

- 6. While on duty with the requesting agency, an officer shall be subject to the lawful operational commands of his/her superior officers in the requesting agency, but shall, for personnel and administrative purposes, remain under the control of his/her own agency, including for purposes of pay. An officer shall furthermore be entitled to Worker's Compensation and the same benefits to the extent as though he/she were functioning within the normal scope of his/her duties.
- 7. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to enter into mutual assistance agreements with other law enforcement agencies in accordance with such reasonable arrangements, terms, and conditions as may be agreed upon between the respective heads of the law enforcement agencies.

WHEREAS, the resolutions contained herein supersede all resolutions previously adopted by the Board with respect to the subject matter of these resolutions, but the resolutions contained herein are not intended to limit the effect of any resolutions previously adopted with respect to actions previously taken by officers of the Corporation and the College.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board hereby adopts the following resolutions:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING OFFICER ACTION WITH REGARD TO REAL ESTATE

RESOLVED, that the President and the Vice President be, and each hereby is, authorized to execute and deliver in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation listing agreements, contracts for the purchase or sale of real estate, deeds or any other instruments conveying title to or interest in real estate, leases (whether as lessee or lessor), mortgages, deeds of trust, or other documents of encumbrance (provided, however, that such authority shall not extend to any document relating to or effecting the sale of real property that constitutes all or a part of the college campus in Davidson, North Carolina or the lake campus on Lake Norman) (collectively, the "Real Estate Documents");

RESOLVED, that, to give effect to the foregoing powers, each of said officers is hereby authorized to execute and deliver any and all assignments, endorsements, powers of attorney, releases, bills of sale, agreements, consents, or any other legal documents required in connection therewith; and

RESOLVED, that the Secretary or any Assistant Secretary of the Corporation be, and each hereby is, authorized to certify and attest to, from time to time, the names and the specimen signatures of any officer of the Corporation and to certify as to any other matters that he or she may deem appropriate in connection with any Real Estate Documents or performance thereof without the necessity of further action by the Corporation.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING OFFICER ACTION WITH REGARD TO INITIATING AND FINANCING CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

RESOLVED, that President and the Vice President be, and each hereby is, authorized to undertake construction or capital projects budgeted to cost \$1,000,000 or less, and to execute and deliver on behalf of the Corporation all agreements and documents required in connection therewith (the "Construction Documents") and take all actions that such officer may in his or her discretion deem necessary or appropriate in order to carry out the full intent and purposes of the foregoing; and

RESOLVED, that the Secretary or any Assistant Secretary of the Corporation be, and each hereby is, authorized to certify and attest to, from time to time, the names and the specimen signatures of any officer of the Corporation and to certify as to any other matters that he or she may deem appropriate in connection with any Construction Documents or performance thereof without the necessity of further action by the Corporation.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING OFFICER ACTION WITH REGARD TO SECURITIES

RESOLVED, that the President and the Vice President be, and each hereby is, authorized to sell, assign, transfer, deliver, convey, pledge, hypothecate, redeem, exchange, exercise or deposit any stocks, bonds, rights, warrants, certificates of deposit, partnership interests, limited liability company interests, script or any other securities (collectively, "Securities") now registered or which may hereafter be registered in the name of the Corporation, the College, the Davidson Athletic Foundation, the Ne Ultra Society, WDAV Classical 89.9 Radio, the Fund for Davidson, or any similar group, organization, or fund of the College, or owned by any of them or to which any of them may be entitled;

RESOLVED, that the President be, and hereby is, authorized and empowered to adopt a policy delegating the authority to sell Securities received by the Corporation or the College by way of gift or distribution;

RESOLVED, that, in connection with the purchase of securities from funds that have been approved by the Investment Committee or that is otherwise authorized pursuant to the Statement of Investment Policies ("<u>Investment Securities</u>"), the President and the Vice President be, and each hereby is, authorized to execute and deliver investment agreements, partnership agreements, limited liability company agreements, subscription agreements, and similar investment documents;

RESOLVED, that in connection with the purchase of securities made by or on behalf of the Corporation in connection with College-sponsored entrepreneurship programs and competitions, the President and the Vice President be, and each hereby is,

authorized to execute and deliver investment agreements, partnership agreements, limited liability company agreements, warrants and similar investment agreements provided that the consideration paid by the Corporation pursuant to such documents does not exceed \$100,000;

RESOLVED, that, to give effect to such powers, each of said officers is hereby authorized to execute and deliver any and all assignments, enforcements, powers of attorney, releases, bills of sale, agreements, consents or any other legal documents required in connection therewith and take all actions that such officer may in his or her discretion deem necessary or appropriate in order to carry out the full intent and purposes of the foregoing resolution; and

RESOLVED, that the Secretary or any Assistant Secretary of the Corporation be, and they hereby are, authorized to certify and attest to, from time to time, the names and the specimen signatures of any officer of the Corporation and to certify as to any other matters that he or she may deem appropriate in connection with any Securities or performance thereof without the necessity of further action by the Corporation.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING OFFICER ACTION WITH REGARD TO INSURANCE

RESOLVED, that the President and the Vice President be, and each hereby is, authorized to execute and deliver insurance releases on behalf of the Corporation; and

RESOLVED, that the Secretary or any Assistant Secretary of the Corporation be, and they hereby are, authorized to certify and attest to, from time to time, the names and the specimen signatures of any officer of the Corporation and to certify as to any other matters that he or she may deem appropriate in connection with any insurance releases or performance thereof without the necessity of further action by the Corporation.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING OFFICER ACTION WITH REGARD TO BANK ACCOUNTS

RESOLVED, that the following officers and employees be, and each hereby is, authorized to sign checks, including by electronic signature, on behalf of the Corporation and to authorize wire transfers and make payments by other electronic means from a Corporation account in the following manner:

- (i) that any one of the President, Vice President, or the Controller and Director of Business Services of the College may so act when the amount is not in excess of \$15,000;
- (ii) that any two of the President, Vice President, Controller and Director of Business Services, or any Associate or Assistant Controller of the College may so act when the amount is in excess of \$15,000 but not in excess of \$150,000; and

(iii) that any one of the President, Vice President, or the Vice President of Academic Affairs seconding an act by any one of the Controller and Director of Business Services, Associate or Assistant Controller of the College may so act when the amount is in excess of \$150,000.

RESOLVED, that the President, the Vice President, the Controller and Director of Business Services, and any Associate or Assistant Controller be, and each hereby is, authorized to:

- (i) open and close deposit accounts on behalf of the Corporation;
- (ii) enter into safe deposit agreements on behalf of the Corporation;
- (iii) enter into electronic funds transfer agreements, lock box agreements or other funds management agreements on behalf of the Corporation; and
- (iv) sign all instruments and documents required in connection with the foregoing.

RESOLVED, that, if any banking or other financial institution requires the Corporation to adopt resolutions authorizing officers of the Corporation to open deposit accounts, enter into safe deposit agreements, electronic funds transfer agreements, lock box agreements or other fund management agreements on behalf of the Corporation, such resolutions shall be deemed adopted by the Corporation upon signing of the agreement in which such resolutions are contained by the President, Vice President, Secretary or any Assistant Secretary of the Corporation; and

RESOLVED, that the Secretary or any Assistant Secretary of the Corporation be, and they hereby are, authorized to certify and attest, from time to time, to any financial institution the names and the specimen signatures of any officer of the Corporation and to certify as to any other matters that he or she may deem appropriate in connection with any action with regard to Corporation bank accounts without the necessity of further action by the Corporation.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING OFFICER ACTION WITH REGARD TO POLICY GUIDELINES ON DEFERRED GIVING

RESOLVED, that the President and Vice President be, and they hereby are, authorized to enter into any agreements and other documents relating to pooled income funds, life income plans, charitable remainder trusts, charitable lead trusts and any life remainder funds or trusts for which the College serves as trustee;

RESOLVED, that the President and the Vice President, be, and each of them hereby is, authorized to negotiate with any potential donor any deferred giving plans or agreements of similar purpose; and

RESOLVED, that the Secretary or any Assistant Secretary of the Corporation be, and they hereby are, authorized to certify and attest to, from time to time, the names and the specimen signatures of any officer of the Corporation and to certify as to any other matters that he or she may deem appropriate in connection with any deferred giving plan or agreement or performance thereof without the necessity of further action by the Corporation.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING OFFICER ACTION WITH REGARD TO LOAN PROGRAMS

RESOLVED, that the President, Vice President, and Vice President and Dean of Admissions and Financial Aid or any officer or employee of the College designated and authorized to act by any such officer, in each case acting alone or jointly, be, and hereby are, authorized to execute, deliver and perform, from time to time, any agreements or documents related to any loan programs, including, without limitation, agreements to (a) provide information and process student loans, (b) serve as agent for the respective lenders with regard to loans and loan applications and (c) guarantee obligations of the respective borrowers under the loans (collectively, the "Loan Program Documents"), and take all actions that such officer may in his or her discretion deem necessary or appropriate in order to carry out the full intent and purposes of the foregoing, the negotiation, preparation, execution, delivery or performance thereof by such officer to be conclusive evidence of the approval thereof by the Corporation; and

RESOLVED, that the Secretary or any Assistant Secretary of the Corporation be, and each hereby is, authorized to certify and attest to, from time to time, the names and the specimen signatures of any officer of the Corporation and to certify as to any other matters that he or she may deem appropriate in connection with any Loan Program Documents, or performance thereof without the necessity of further action by the Corporation.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING OFFICER ACTION WITH REGARD TO CONTRACT AUTHORITY POLICY

RESOLVED, that the President be, and hereby is, authorized and empowered to adopt a policy with regard to the authority to review and execute contracts valued at \$1,000,000 or less on behalf of the College (the "Contract Authority Policy");

RESOLVED, that the officers and employees of the College to whom the President grants such authority to review and execute contracts as set forth in such Contract Authority Policy shall have all the rights, powers and privileges grated therein; and

RESOLVED, that the Secretary or any Assistant Secretary of the Corporation be, and they hereby are, authorized to certify and attest to, from time to time, the names and the specimen signatures of any officer of the Corporation and to certify as to any other matters that he or she may deem appropriate in connection with the Contract Authority Policy without the necessity of further action by the Corporation.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING OFFICER ACTION WITH REGARD TO SETTLEMENT OF LITIGATION, MEDIATION OR ARBITRATION

RESOLVED, that the President and the Vice President be, and each hereby is, authorized to enter into any settlement agreements or other contracts (collectively, the "<u>Settlement Documents</u>") to settle the College's liability arising in connection with any litigation, mediation, or arbitration (each, a "<u>Proceeding</u>") to which the College is a party provided that the College's aggregate financial obligation under all Settlement Documents relating to a specific Proceeding does not exceed \$1,000,000 and provided further that any such Settlement Documents do not result in an admission of guilt, fault or liability by the Corporation with respect to the claims giving rise to the applicable Proceeding;

RESOLVED, that the President and the Vice President be, and each hereby is, authorized to take all actions and enter into any such contracts or other documents that such officer may in his or her discretion deem necessary or appropriate in order to carry out the full intent and purposes of the foregoing, the negotiation, preparation, execution, delivery or performance thereof by such officer to be conclusive evidence of the approval thereof by the Corporation; and

RESOLVED, that the Secretary or any Assistant Secretary of the Corporation be, and each hereby is, authorized to certify and attest to, from time to time, the names and the specimen signatures of any officer of the Corporation and to certify as to any other matters that he or she may deem appropriate in connection with any Settlement Documents, or performance thereof without the necessity of further action by the Corporation.

Contracts Policy

<u>**Purpose:**</u> Establishes a policy and procedure for the execution, enforcement, and signatory authority for all contracts for Davidson College.

<u>Definitions</u>: A "College Contract" includes any agreement, promise to perform, lease, or contract that creates an obligation, right, or liability for Davidson College. This policy applies to the initial contract and to every amendment, renewal or extension of such a contract.

<u>Policy</u>: All College Contracts shall be in writing, and executed in accordance with the terms of this policy. All College Contracts must be approved or signed by an authorized legal representative of the College who has been delegated that authority. No individual should enter into a College Contract without following the administrative review procedures set forth in this policy.

Procedures:

Administrative Review of College Contracts

The following steps must be taken by the person initiating the College Contract for signature:

- 1. Read the contract entirely, and determine that:
 - a. The contract language is clear and consistent and accurately reflects the current state of negotiations;
 - b. The contract meets the programmatic requirements and the mission of the College;
 - c. The business unit entering into the contract can ensure compliance with the obligations the contract places on the College;
 - d. The business unit entering into the contract has consulted with all divisions or departments affected by the contract, including divisions and departments that will need to provide support, facilities, or personnel to carry out the obligations of the contract;
 - e. Where applicable, funds have been identified to pay contract fees;
 - f. All parties to the contract have appropriate levels of insurance coverage;
 - g. The contract complies with applicable laws (including FERPA) and college policies, as well as sponsor, donor, or other restrictions, if applicable; and
 - h. The contract terms have been approved by the person with authority to sign the contract. See details in Authority to Sign Contracts Section.
- 2. Determine whether there is an existing College template for the obligations covered by the contract that should be used instead. Existing College templates include consulting contracts, employment contracts, contracts for private donations, performance or speaker contracts, facilities use agreements, and waivers.
- 3. Confirm that there are no conflicts of interest. See details in Related Policies section.

4. Determine whether the College Contract requires advance review by General Counsel, Chief Information Officer, Controller, or Director of Human Resources. See details in Advance Review of College Contracts section.

Advance Review of College Contracts

- 1. College Contracts require **advance review by General Counsel** for any of the following reasons:
 - a. The contract amount exceeds \$250,000 or has a term of 5 years or longer, regardless of contract amount (but purchase orders in excess of \$250,000 do not require general counsel review);
 - b. The contract obligates the College to defend, indemnify, or hold harmless the other party (but College templates do not require general counsel review);
 - c. The contract seeks to limit the amounts or types of liability of the other party (but College templates do not require general counsel review);
 - d. The contract involves heightened risks or liabilities for the College;
 - e. The contract involves student or employee data; or
 - f. The person initiating the contract has questions about whether the contract complies with applicable laws and college policies.
- 2. College Contracts require **advance review by the Chief Information Officer** for any of the following reasons:
 - a. The contract relates primarily to technology (hardware, software, and/or SaaS applications); or
 - b. The contract requires ITS to provide technical support or other services.
- 3. College Contracts require **advance review by the Controller** for any of the following reasons:
 - a. The contract requires payment to a non-U.S. citizen or entity;
 - b. The contract is for a performer or speaker who resides outside of North Carolina and who is being paid for services; and
 - c. Donor agreements establishing a program in which the College makes payments to students (including, but not limited to, summer internship programs, research and travel grants).
- 4. College Contracts require **advance review by the Director of Human Resources** if they relate to:
 - a. Employment matters; or
 - b. Services provided by independent contractors.

Advance Review Procedures

The first review of all contracts should be conducted by the person initiating the College Contract for signature. That individual should confirm the contract accurately reflects the current state of negotiations before submitting it for advance review.

Plan on at least two weeks for advance review. Turnaround may be shorter, workload permitting, but if a contract requires advance review by General Counsel, Chief Information Officer, Controller, and/or Director of Human Resources, it may take two weeks or possibly longer.

Authority to Sign Contracts

The Trustees of Davidson College have authorized the President to enter into contracts, subject to policy guidelines established by the Trustees and subject to the resolution adopted at a meeting held on April 12, 2002, authorizing certain officers of the college to enter into certain agreements, related to the purchase and sale of real estate and securities. No individual has authority to approve or sign College Contracts unless that individual has a valid delegation of authority from the President.

The authority to approve and enter into College Contracts is delegated by the President as follows. However, the President reserves the right to review each contract on a case by case basis. The authority to approve and enter into College Contracts may be delegated only as set forth below and any designation of authority should be made in writing.

It is the responsibility of the authorized individual who executives the College Contract to confirm that the appropriate administrative review steps have been followed, including any required advance review of the contract.

General Contracts exceeding \$100,000 or with a term of 5 years or longer (regardless of contract amount)	Vice President for Finance and Administration; in addition: any general contract exceeding \$250,000 shall be reviewed by General Counsel prior to signature; and contracts that relate primarily to technology (hardware and software) shall be reviewed by the Chief Information Officer prior to signature	
General Contracts	Division Head or his/her designee; provided that contracts that relate primarily to technology (hardware and software) shall be reviewed by the Chief Information Officer prior to signature	
Employment Contracts for Faculty	Tenure-track appointments normally are signed by the President, but authority may be delegated to the Vice President for Academic Affairs. Faculty appointments other than tenure-track appointments are signed by the Vice President for Academic Affairs	
Employment Contracts for Intercollegiate Athletics	While normally signed by the President and Director of Athletics, authority may be delegated to the Director of Athletics	
Contracts Related to Energy, Utilities, Campus Operations, and Construction and Design	Vice President for Finance and Administration or Director of Physical Plant; provided that any contract in this category exceeding \$250,000 shall be reviewed by the Vice President for Finance and Administration and General Counsel prior to signature

Recordkeeping:

The authorized individual who executes the contract is responsible for keeping the original of the executed contract, including all attachments, for at least three (3) years after the expiration of the contract. Business Services may request a copy of the contract in order to process payment.



- WHEREAS: The General Assembly of North Carolina did enact into law statutes to authorize mutual aid assistance between law enforcement agencies whereby full authorization may be exercised for law enforcement agencies to send personnel and equipment beyond the territorial jurisdiction which they normally serve, said acts having been codified as N. C. General Statutes 90-95.2 and 160A-288 et seq.
- WHEREAS: The purpose of such agreement is to provide each of the law enforcement agencies a pre-determined plan by which each of them might render aid to the other in case of civil disorder, natural disaster, or other situations or emergencies which demand law enforcement services beyond the existing capability of other agency;
- WHEREAS: It is deemed to be in the public interest for the City of Monroe to adopt a reasonable policy and guidelines for entering into reciprocal law enforcement agreement whereby assistance can be both rendered to and obtained from other state and local governmental jurisdictions;

That the City of Monroe shall assume all costs of salaries, wages, or other compensation for its own personnel who respond to requests for mutual aid assistance, and shall further assume all costs involving the use of supplies and equipment used specifically in response to the request for assistance.
- 7. That while on duty with a requesting agency, Monroe Public Safety Officers shall be subject to the lawful operational orders of the commanding officer of the requesting agency, but for personnel and administrative purposes they shall remain under the control and authority of the Monroe Public Safety Department and the City of Monroe.
- 8. That the Chief of Public Safety may at any time terminate a mutual aid agreement upon the mailing by certified mail of a written notice to the chief executive officer of the other agency.
- 9. That when working with the requesting agency pursuant to a mutual aid agreement, an officer shall have the same jurisdiction, powers, rights, privileges, and immunities (including those relating to the defense of civil actions and payments of judgments) as the officers of the requesting agency in addition to those he normally possesses. He shall furthermore be entitled to workmen's compensation and the same benefit when acting pursuant to a mutual aid request to the same extent as though he were functioning within the normal scope of his duties.

10. That this resolution will amend and replace any previous resolution of the City Council pertaining to law enforcement mutual aid assistance agreements.





RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE POLICE CHIEF TO ENTER INTO LAW ENFORCEMENT MUTUAL ASSISTANCE AGREEMENTS WITH OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute 160A-288 promotes cooperation between law enforcement agencies by authorizing the head of any law enforcement agency to temporarily provide assistance to another agency in enforcing the laws of North Carolina if so requested in writing by the head of the requesting agency; and

WHEREAS, the assistance may comprise allowing officers of the agency to work temporarily with officers of the requesting agency and lending equipment and supplies; and

WHEREAS, while working with the requesting agency under the authority of this statute, an officer shall have the same jurisdiction, powers, rights, privileges, and immunities as the officer of the requesting agency, in addition to those he normally possesses; and

WHEREAS, while on duty with the requesting agency, the officer shall be subject to the lawful operational command of his superior officers in the requesting agency, but for personnel and administrative purposes, he shall remain under the control of his own agency, including for purposes of pay; and

WHEREAS, an officer shall be entitled to Workmen's Compensation and the same benefits when acting pursuant to a law enforcement assistance agreement to the extent as though he were functioning within the normal scope of his duties;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STATESVILLE that the Police Chief of the City of Statesville be designated the "Head" of the City's Police Department as the term is used in North Carolina General Statute 160A-288 and the said Police Chief is hereby delegated authority to make or grant requests pursuant to this statute.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Police Chief of the City of Statesville is hereby authorized to enter into agreements for exchanging law enforcement officers, equipment or supplies in accordance with the provisions of North Carolina General Statute 160A-288.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING A POLICY FOR MUTUAL AID ASSISTANCE WITH OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

WHEREAS, pursuant to North Carolina General Statutes GS160A-288 and GS 90-95.2, the governing body of a city or county may adopt appropriate guidelines, for the purpose of mutual aid assistance with other municipal and county law enforcement agencies; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said laws, the law enforcement assistance to be rendered authorizes lending officers to work temporarily with officers of the requesting agencies, including in an undercover capacity, and lending equipment and supplies; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the best interest of the Town of Wadesboro to adopt a reasonable policy and guidelines whereby reciprocal law enforcement assistance can both be rendered to obtained from other governmental jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, such reciprocal assistance is necessary for effective law enforcement for the protection of the citizens of the Town of Wadesboro,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF WADESBORO THAT:

- 1. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to enter into mutual assistance arrangements with other municipal and county law enforcement agencies, provided that the head of the requesting law enforcement agency makes such a request in writing.
- 2. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to permit officers of the Wadesboro Police Department to work temporarily with the Officers of the requesting agency, including in and undercover; capacity; and the Chief of Police may lend such equipment and supplies to the requesting agencies as he/she deems advisable.
- 3. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to request officers of other law enforcement agencies to work temporarily with officers of the Wadesboro Police Department including in an undercover capacity; and the Chief of Police may borrow such equipment and supplies from other law enforcement agencies as he/she deems advisable.
- 4. All such requests and authorizations shall be in accordance with North Carolina General Statues 160A-288 and GS 90-95.2, as applicable.

- 5. While working with a requesting agency, an officer shall, have the same jurisdiction, powers, rights, privileges and immunities including those relating to the defense of civil actions and payment of judgments as the officers of the requesting agency in addition to those he/she normally possesses.
- 6. While on duty with the requesting agency, an officer shall be subject to the lawful operational commands of his/her superior officers in the requesting agency, but shall, for personnel and administrative purposes, remain under the control of his/her own agency, including for purposes of pay. An officer shall furthermore be entitled to Worker's Compensation and the same benefits to the extent as though he/she were functioning within the normal scope of his/her duties.
- 7. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to enter into mutual assistance agreements with other law enforcement agencies in accordance with such reasonable arrangements, terms, and conditions as may be agreed upon between the respective heads of the law enforcement agencies.
