







## Local Needs, Future Resiliency

Centralina is helping member governments and partners develop shared strategies to plan for and achieve low-cost reductions in greenhouse gas emissions, create economic growth and job creation to foster a low carbon economy and see substantial public health cobenefits. Ultimately efforts focus on successfully accessing **\$4.6 billion** in implementation grant funds designed to support local needs and priorities. If your organizational priorities can be supported by these funds, it is **imperative that you be engaged with our region's planning work** – projects must be included in our region's Priority Climate Action Plan to be eligible.

Feb. 2024

Optional **Intent to Apply** deadline for competitive round due 2/1.

March 2024 Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP) due 3/1. Measures applied for in April must be included in PCAP.

April 2024

Competitive round of \$4.6 billion in implementation funds due **4/1** for regional & local projects/measures.


Anticipated timing for funds to be awarded to selected recipients.
