#### **Work Recap**

#### **NCEM Update**

- Kaine and Chris brought in as partners after working in a vacuum. We want to support the state in the path to resiliency.
  - They will discuss where we are with FEMA BRIC and Grants, and contracts to be updated in the 5-year update process.

#### - Kaine

- o 33 construction projects from LOI to full application
- 11 building and capacity grants
- o 7 projects that were not selected last year are up for selection again this year.
  - FEMA gives feedback on why projects were not funded. This gives opportunity for improvement.



- Flood mitigation and assistance LOI is open until December. This will fund projects and capacity building. This contains everything leading up to construction. This is a \$2million dollar state allocation selected by state panels.
  - Allows individual processes to continue. Difference between FMA and BREC is that FMA is directly tied to the National Flood insurance programs.
  - Grants Letter of Interest Form NCDPS.gov/BRIC has templates that allow businesses to request information from FEMA.
  - Get an LOI in by December 1<sup>st</sup>
- o Centralina is proactive in holding workshops.

#### - Chris Crew (NCEM)

- o Map of NC that shows numerous organizations in counties and different regions.
- 2005 5 we took over a project to consolidate 156 Hazard mitigation plans that are now 32 Regional Hazard mitigation plans.
  - Any participating community needs an approved and adopted plan.
  - NC is the only state with 100% county coverage approved at the time.
- 13 regional plans covering 50 counties will be expiring before November 2025.
  - There are 4 plans that will affect Centralina plans.
  - 18 months before expirations, planning meetings start occurring with stakeholders to begin the process of renewing plans.
    - Needs stakeholders from all categories to participate in order to not fall short during grant talks.
    - Needs to broaden stakeholder participation in this process.
  - New FEMA guidance came out in April 2023, looking to delve deeper into equity issues that affect underrepresented populations. There are 17 groups that are underrepresented.
    - Need to determine who is underrepresented in regions and counties.
  - Identify particular impacts of a changing climate on operations.
    - Droughts and rainfall
    - Heat injuries

## Heat Impacts on populations

- Could this be connected to a public alert system?
- Volunteer registry in EM departments How to create a bridge between disasters, aging populations, and the gap in understanding how a public alert system brings awareness.
  - Process on outreach relies heavily on the National Weather Service
- Value of these plans is not the document; the value is in the process of meetings and collaboration to create these plans.
  - Local Governments develop connections.
  - All counties are going through a process to develop an HMP (?)



#### - COG

- Helps Local Gov staff with FEMA PA Requirements to ensure local issues are addressed.
- Assists Local Gov leaders to identify Recovery Staff and day to day responsibilities.
- Getting trained in Early December 2023. Each COG will reach out to local government units to train between January – June 2024. Ranges from in person to individual training.

## - 16 PA Recovery Modules

- Modules that define certain steps and processes to ensure proper guidance is followed.
- o Ranges from Public Assistance to Training exercises overview.

## - COG PA Training -→ Resilience Road Map

- o Organizing to planning to managing recovery programs.
- o Accesses capabilities quicker than previously.
- o Robert Graham
  - Issues with COVID reimbursement.
  - Could be an opportunity to put out a survey of all jurisdictions to see where they are on recovery dollars from COVID.
  - Currently fighting with FEMA. We used contractors from the city. FEMA gave us pushback for this.
  - FEMA had told us to do what we need to do.
  - There is an opportunity to get what is being sought for recovery in counties and creating a recovery program.
  - We need to understand the challenges we had to be prepared for the next big event.

## - Centralina Local Gov PA Training Dates

- Two full day trainings offered at Centralina Offices on Jan 23 and Feb 8, 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

#### - Resilience roadmap

- o Left off when everyone completed Improvement Plans.
- o IEM would like for the Plans to be reviewed and adjusted as necessary.

#### Roadmap Progress

- o IEM askes stakeholders to score their activity and information between 1-4.
- o The target is a median score of 2. The aggregate score is now 2.07.

## - Improvement Planning Insights

o IEM needs stakeholders to go back to Ips and their targets. Look through at progress and assessments made. Determine the status of where the plans are through the Planning Insights.

#### Road Map Heads Up

 A column will be added on the right side of the table to update the score and provide reasons why the score was listed as it was.



- o This will also include a place to identify lessons learned and best practices.
- o Information will be aggregated again and create an overview of the region where best practices and issues can be identified.

## - Pre-Disaster Recovery Planning Timeline

Focus is on Health and Social Services.

#### - Health and Social Services Committee Annex

- Coordinate with providers in community to connect needs for volunteers, family assistance, etc.
- o Provide easily accessible information to the public to help recovery.

#### - Subcommittee Partners

 Each subcommittee should identify Lead and Support Agencies. Identify and assign as appropriate.

#### - State and Federal Partners

o If state or federal support is needed, this list holds agencies to reach out to.

#### - Annex Elements

o Focus on Misson, objectives, partners, subcommittee and its own subsections.

#### Donations and Volunteers Subcommittee

- Objective is to manage solicited and unsolicited donations and volunteers to help with Recovery.
- Involves coordinating with local NGOs, local VOADs, Faith Based Communities, and community-based organizations and developing strategies to manage volunteers and financial donations.

#### - Donations and Volunteers Activities

- Focus on pre-disaster phases such as resources or services available from partners and understanding the resources they do and don't have.
- o Put together a list of messages prepared for sending out during a disaster.
- o Pre identify staging areas for storage and volunteers.
- o Transition between short- and long-term recovery. Some groups will send out information regarding what is and what is not needed.

## - Individual and Family Services Subcommittee

- Helps social services and local VOAD take leadership roles in the events of a recovery.
  - They have the abilities to connect with providers.

## - IFSS Phased Activities

- o Coordinate messaging, animal care, sheltering, reunification.
- Coordinate to ensure local community can communicate to local groups of people specific to towns.

#### - Public Health and Medical Services Subcommittee

- Supports local healthcare providers and provides info on health-related issues.
- Supports local healthcare providers in reestablishing services and support.
- o Broad, includes state, local, and private agencies that focus on health.

#### - PHMSS Phased Activities



- Make sure Continuity plans are up to date, this will ensure services will get back up and running.
- Build relationships and establish a Health emergency Workgroup to build familiarity.
- o Public messaging alerts and PODs can be organized.
- Mobile Health providers can scout locations where underrepresented populations live.

#### - Schools and Academic Institutions and Subcommittee

- Provides recovery support to local school districts, private schools, and higher education.
- o Pre-disaster phase involves creating an education emergency workgroup.
- o Provides assistance by promoting individual and family preparedness.
- Transition phase supports planning between schools and what to expect from the recovery process.
- Viable shelter locations, can provide information regarding shelter capacity, available for pets, etc.

#### - Action Items

- o Evaluate templated structure, modify as needed.
- o Review your county information.
- o Determine lead and support agencies, make sure they get involved.
