Closing Out the 118th Congress

Federal lawmakers returned to Capitol Hill on September 9 for a three-week session before breaking again on September 27, 2024, until after Election Day. In those three weeks, the House and Senate are expected to draft and vote on a stopgap spending bill, known as a continuing resolution, to avoid a full or partial government shutdown when the new fiscal year begins October 1, 2024.

Several bills have passed one chamber or the other with strong bipartisan support and could move to the President's desk, including the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act and Older Americans Act. However, neither bill has moved at all in the other chamber, which undermines their prospects for enactment in this Congress. Even less likely to pass this year is the Farm Bill, passed by the House Agriculture Committee in May.
